Jack rabbits travel as fast as 40 miles per hour and make big zigzag jumps. This method of hopping helps them to escape from the many animals who hunt them, including bobcats, foxes, and snakes.

How will you know if you have seen a jack rabbit? Compared with a bunny, a jack rabbit is big (about 24 inches) and has long ears. Also, jack rabbits make long hops. They can jump 5 to 10 feet, and even 20 feet when scared.
